One-Time Public Safety State Aid

The 2023 omnibus tax bill included \$210 million in one-time public safety aid that will be distributed on Dec. 26, 2023, to cities across the state.

The \$210 million was divided on a per capita basis.


The City of Bloomington will receive \$3,899,210 of the one-time public safety state aid.

There is not a spend-by date requirement in the law.

The funds must be used to provide "public safety" and cannot act as an ongoing reserve.

\$716,000 allocated to Fire Department

These funds will be used to acquire fire small equipment and relieve some projected costs to be incurred to the fire small equipment fund.

- Rescue tools and equipment
- Medical response equipment
- Personal Protective Equipment
- Hazardous Materials response equipment
- Software upgrade for Fire Records Management
- US Digital Server upgrade for station alerting
